Ken Wilber's 20 Tenets of the Tendencies of Evolutionary Systems

- 1. Reality as a whole is composed of 'Holons'
- 2. All holons display the fundamental capacity of agency or self-preservation
- 3. All holons display the fundamental capacity of communion or self-adaptation
- 4. All holons display the fundamental capacity of eros or self-transcendence
- 5. All holons display the fundamental capacity of thanatos or self-dissolution
- 6. Holons emerge
- 7. Holons emerge holarchically
- 8. Each emergent holon transcends but includes its predecessor(s)
- 9. A lower holon sets the possibilities of the higher and the higher holon sets the possibilities of the lower
- 10. The number of levels that a holarchy comprises determines whether it is 'shallow' or 'deep' and the number of holons on any level determines its 'span'
- 11. Each successive level of evolution produces greater depth and less span.
- 12. The greater the depth of a holon, the greater its degree of Consciousness
- 13. Destroy any holon and all the holons above are destroyed but none of the holons below
- 14. Holarchies co-evolve
- 15. The micro is in relational exchange with the macro at all levels of its depth
- 16. Evolution has a directionality of increasing complexity
- 17. Evolution has a directionality of increasing differentiation/integration
- 18. Evolution has a directionality of increasing organisation/structuration
- 19. Evolution has a directionality of increasing relative autonomy
- 20. Evolution has a directionality of increasing telos/destiny

Additionally: Every holon issues an IOU to the Universe and all IOUs are redeemed in Emptiness/Oneness/Divinity
